2 Senate

There are 12 seats available. The 12 candidates with the most votes win.

6 senators were elected to a 2 year seat in the 2022 ASOSU Election and are referred to as 'Legacy Senators' as they were elected by the student body prior to the enactment of the new ASOSU Constitution (which takes effect June 1, 2023). These individuals will retain their seat until June 1, 2024. Given that 18 senate seats total are available, these 'legacy' senators take up 6, leaving 12 seats up for election this year.

Not all of the candidates who won have accepted their positions. The tie-breaker between the 12th place finishers will be determined at a later date per the process in the ASOSU Statutes.

2321 students voted in this race.




